



Light Functions

1. Introduction \sim Before Use \sim

[1] Open the battery cover and insert two D-sized batteries (C and AA batteries can also be used).

%The power will automatically switch to battery during a power outage or when the power cord is removed. Insert batteries so that you do not miss an emergency broadcast.

Replace the batteries once a year.

XUse alkaline batteries only (other batteries cannot be used).



(1) Push down strongly on the arrow mark in the center.



(2) Pull the cover down while continuing to press the arrow mark.



(3) Insert batteries and follow the steps in reverse order to replace the cover.

[2] • Plug the power cord into the right side of the device and the other end into a

power outlet \rightarrow Fig. A

• Turn the power switch to the ON position \rightarrow Fig. B

• The AC light on the front will turn green after 8 seconds \rightarrow Fig. C

[3] Installation

• Extend the antenna on the back of the device so that it can receive broadcasts.

XPlace the device near a window with good visibility (where there is as little radio wave obstruction as possible).



Fully extend the rod antenna and position it upright

2. Operation

[1] Recording functions

Automatic recording

• Emergency transmissions and district/town broadcasts are recorded automatically when received.

Away-from-home recording

• To record broadcasts other than emergency transmissions and district/town broadcasts, use away-from-home recording. When a broadcast is received, the recording light will flash orange.

% If there are unplayed recordings, the orange light will continue flashing.




Away-from-home Recording

- Press the Record button during standby.
- You will hear a beep and the recording light will turn green. Recording is now possible.
- When a broadcast is received, the recording light will flash orange and green alternately.
- Recording time is limited to 40 minutes.
- If you press the Record button while away-from-home recording is set, you will hear a two beeps,

the recording light will turn off, and away-from-home recording will be canceled.

How to Play Recorded Content



Skip Forward	• Press [Play/Next] during playback. If there is another broadcast, you will hear a beep sound. If there is not, you will hear a boop sound.	OKI	2	
Go Back	• Press [Back] within 2 seconds after the start. You will hear a two beeps.			
Play from Start	• Press [Back] 3 seconds or more after the start. You will hear a beep sound.	******	•	
Stop Playback	• Press [Emergency Release/Stop] during playback to return to standby mode. You will hear a boop sound.		Back	Play/Next

- [2] Volume adjustment
- Rotate the volume adjustment dial to the right to increase the volume.
- •During emergency broadcasts, the volume will be set to maximum automatically.

Press Emergency Release/Stop

and the volume will return to the regular level.
